All coaches should be familiar with the NFHS Baseball Rulebook, NYSPHSAA Handbook and Section VIII Directory as it pertains to baseball.


Unusual situations, not specifically included in this handbook, will be ruled on by the Baseball Committee.

1. Starting Time

- A. Due to ongoing bus issues throughout Section VIII, most games have either a 4:45 or 5:00 starting time when played on school days. Games may start earlier upon agreement of both schools and availability of umpires.
- B. Visiting coaches should inform the hosting coach if they will be late due to bus issues.
- C. The regular season high school baseball schedule includes Spring Break. Teams and coaches should expect that games will be scheduled during this time period and rescheduling games for vacation purposes is not a legitimate reason to do so.

2. Official Game Definitions

A. <u>Regular Season</u>- An official game is 5 innings or 4 and one-half if the home team is ahead. If a winner can be determined or is tied and no more baseball can be played that day, the game is over and a winner is declared or ends in a tie. The game does not have to go 7 innings. See <u>Suspended Games</u> rules on page 24 for additional clarifications.

B. Playoffs-

- <u>Sectional Games (through Nassau County Championship)</u>- All Sectional playoff games
 are to be played the full 7 innings (unless the run rule is achieved or home team is ahead
 after 6 and one-half innings).
- <u>Regional Games (Long Island Championship and beyond)</u>- All Regional playoff games will follow the NYSPHSAA rule defining official games:
 - "An official game is 5 innings or 4 and one-half if the home team is ahead. If a winner can be determined and no more baseball can be played that day, the game is over and a winner is declared. The game does not have to go 7 innings."
- C. <u>Run Rule</u>- Games will end and be declared official with a run differential of 10 runs or more after 5 innings or 4 and one-half if the home team is ahead. The home team is always entitled to equal number of at bats if the visiting team goes up by 10 or more runs.

3. Postponed Games

Games that are not official, must be played on the next rain makeup date (current series to take precedence over games from earlier series). If the game to be played is the first or second game of a series, the site should be changed, if the original home field is unplayable. If, however, a team cannot play their home game or games on their own field, they will be the home team on the opponent's field. If there is another game scheduled in that series the following day, every

attempt must be made to finish the previous game and then start the next one. This will mean ending the first game at the location of the second game. Full responsibility rests with the home team to complete details for postponed games with opposing teams and officials. Failure to do so may be ruled as a forfeit win for the visiting team.

Off days are to be used as rain dates during the regular season and in the last week to help eliminate any ties for playoff positions.

All League games should be completed by the pre-established last day of the regular season (unless prevented for weather related reasons). All League games must be completed before the playoffs begin. It is the obligation of schools to postpone non-league games in order to complete league commitments. Teams that have not completed their season will have to conclude their season on the first playoff date and then begin the playoffs on that same day. Permission may be given not to play remaining games if they have no bearing on the standings of teams qualifying for the playoffs. Permission must come from the Section VIII Baseball Coordinator.

In the event of the Section VIII Tournament being delayed, the Baseball Committee will dictate necessary schedule changes.

4. Suspended Games- Regular Season Only**

Any game that begins and is stopped:

A. <u>Before it becomes official</u>- the game is a suspended game and is to be resumed at the point of stoppage the following day until completed (7 innings or run rule). Score, inning, count of batter, etc. should all be recorded in the scorebook.

B. After having gone long enough to be an official game and:

- 1. The visitors takes the lead in the top half of the inning but home team does not get their chance to bat or does not complete their at bat- the game reverts back to last completed inning and either a winner is declared or, if tied, the game will be declared a tie.
- 2. The home team ties the game in the bottom half of the inning but doesn't complete the inning- the game is declared a tie.
- 3. The home team takes the lead in the bottom half of the 5th or 6th inning- If the game is called at that point, the home team is declared the winner.

**For Sectional playoff games only (through Nassau County Championship)- an official game will only be declared after 7 innings are completed or 6.5 innings if home team is ahead or if the aforementioned run rule is achieved. Any Sectional playoff game that is suspended will be resumed at point of stoppage. See Appendix, page 38 for Suspended Game rules as they apply to Regional and State Tournament games.

5. Moving Games

Regular Season- League series games within their originally assigned week will take precedence over all non-league and "non-original" league games in that same week. Teams that reschedule an officially scheduled league game outside of their original week run the risk of having that game postponed if their opponent must make up a game in their officially assigned 3 game series for that particular week. As a result, moving league games outside of their originally scheduled week is highly discouraged.

A. Playoffs- See Playoff Weather Guidelines

6. Forfeited Games

"A game shall be forfeited to the offended team by the umpire when a team...refuses to continue play after the game is started" (NFHS Rule 4-4-1b). The umpire-in-chief has sole authority to end games early and will do so only after consultation with head coaches (or their designate) from both teams.

7. Playoff Guidelines

- A. If one game is canceled, it does not mean that all games are canceled. If games can be played, they must be played. No new round of the playoffs will start before all games are completed in the prior round.
- B. If the home team's field is not playable- Refer to Playoff Weather Guidelines on page 17.

8. <u>Pre-Game Procedures</u>

- A. Home team must give field to visiting team no later than 20 minutes before game start time.
- B. Know your league rules relating to pre-game practice, ground rules, games not completed on the scheduled date, protests, etc.
- C. Ground rules in writing, with a copy provided to visiting coaches and umpires, often help to avoid unpleasant situations.
- D. Home teams should provide umpires with 3 new NOCSAE approved baseballs. Each team will provide their own warm-up baseballs.
- E. Code of Conduct- Coaches, participants, spectators and administrators are expected to be familiar with, and abide by, the Code of Conduct published by Section VIII of NYSPHSAA.

Batting Practice

A. There shall be no batting practice prior to any scheduled games with the following exceptions: Schools having early dismissal times are permitted batting practice at their own fields provided it does not delay the game beyond the starting time.

Fielding Practice

Due to later start times: Home teams should conduct their pre-game fielding practice as soon as they arrive to their field. Visiting teams should conduct as much of their pre-game preparation at their home site before their bus arrives. Every effort should be made by teams to start game on time (or earlier if possible) to maximize chances to finish game to completion.

- A. Should be arranged and limited so that games will start at the set starting time.
- B. The home team should begin fielding practice as soon as they arrive at their field.
- C. In general, there should be 15 minutes fielding practice for each team prior to start of game.

9. Officials

A. Only approved officials who are members of the Nassau Approved Baseball Umpire Association shall be hired to officiate school games. There should be two umpires working each game (dependent on umpire availability).

10. Coaching

- A. A coach may coach the team on the bases provided they are wearing a baseball uniform (and hard shell helmet on the baselines).
- B. Section VIII no longer requires game- by- game ratings of umpires during the regular season. The Baseball Executive Committee will devise a process in which umpires are ranked/selected

for post season games which will be shared with the Coaches' Association prior to the end of the regular season.

C. Reporting scores to Newsday- Directions for reporting scores are in Appendix, page 52.

11. Rosters

- A. All rosters must be mailed to your League Representative prior to the first league game.
- B. All reserves must be listed on lineup card that is submitted at pregame meeting at home plate.

12. Other Rules

- A. Spalding Baseballs must be used for all playoff games- ProNFHS (41-100HS). For regular season play, any brand of baseball may be used but must have the NOCSAE stamp on them.
- B. Pitching Restrictions- See NYSPHSAA Pitch Limits in Appendix.
- C. Pitcher MUST take sign from catcher or simulate taking the sign. It not only signals the defensive team that action is about to be initiated, but it also establishes when an offensive base runner(s) can take a lead-off from his/her base.
- D. Catching Equipment- All catchers are required to wear a chest protector that is NOCSAE certified for protection against Commotio Cordis.

2023 NFHS Baseball Rule 1-5

ART. 3...The catcher shall wear, in addition to a head protector, a mask with a throat protector, body/chest protector that meets the NOCSAE standard at the time of manufacture, protective cup (male only), and baseball protective shin guards. The SEI/NOCSAE mark is required on all body/chest protectors that meets the NOCSAE standard at the time of manufacture that will be used in high school competition. Please see the accompanying mark.



What is Commotio Cordis, and How Should You Handle It?

Commotio Cordis (Latin, "agitation of the heart") is an often-lethal disruption of heart rhythm that occurs as a result of a blow to the area directly over the heart (the precordial region) at a critical time during the cycle of a heartbeat, producing what is termed an R-on-T phenomenon that leads to the condition. For catcher's, this most commonly occurs when a ball is fouled straight back and directly impacts the player's chest. The best way to prevent the likelihood of this injury from happening is to make sure the correct, NOCSAE certified, equipment is being used. If you notice a player may have suffered this injury, call 911 immediately in efforts to get a defibrillator on the scene as soon as possible and monitor the player very closely until paramedics arrive.

Class AAA

9 teams will be placed in 1 conference of nine. Each team will play a 2 game series with each team in the conference for a total of 16 league games. Each team will be permitted to play 4 non-league games for a total of 20 games. 1 less NL game for JV for a total of 19 games.

Class AA

18 teams will be placed in 3 conferences of six based on geographic proximity. Each team will play a 3 game series with each team in their conference for a total of 15 league games. Each team will be permitted to play 5 non-league games for a total of 20 games. 1 less NL game for JV for a total of 19 games.

Class A

14 teams will be placed in 2 conferences of seven. Each team will play a 3 game series with each team in their conference for a total of 18 league games. Each team will be permitted to play 2 non-league games for a total of 20 games. 1 less NL game for JV for a total of 19 games.

Class B

5 teams will be placed in 1 conference of five. Each team will play 1 game against each team in their conference during opening week, followed by 3 game series with each team in the conference for a total of 16 league games. Each team will be permitted to play 4 non-league games for a total of 20 games. 1 less NL game for JV for a total of 19 games.

County Wide

11 teams placed in 1 conference. Each team will play a 2 game series with each team in their conference for a total of 20 league games. 1 less game for JV for a total of 19 games.

Tie Breaker Criteria for Playoffs

The Baseball Committee will serve as the main body to determine final playoff seeding positions for the tournament.

Seeding for playoff will be determined by the end of the season league standings.

Total points, taking into account the following point system, will determine final league standings.

The point system will be used to keep standings as followed:

WIN- 2 points

TIE - 1 point

LOSS - 0 points

In the case of teams with equal number of total points at the completion of league play, the following criteria will be used to seed the teams:

- 1. Winning Percentage*
- 2. Head to Head record
- 3. Record vs. teams in your league starting with the highest seeded team in your league in descending order, taking it one spot at a time. If necessary, the process will be repeated with crossover games.
- 4. Winning Percentage of the teams that games were lost against. Team who lost to the team with the higher percentage gets the higher seed.

In the case of three or more teams with equal points and winning percentage, steps two and three will be repeated; after team is eliminated the process will be repeated until there is only one team remaining.

5. If teams remain tied after all steps described above have been examined, a single coin flip conducted by the Baseball Coordinator (or another member of the Executive Council if Baseball Coordinator's home school is one of the impacted teams) will determine seeding. A representative from each impacted team will serve as witness to the coin flip. The coin flip may be conducted virtually. The coin flip will not be used to eliminate a team from playoff entry should there be a tie for the lowest seed. Additional play-in games will be added as necessary.

*If teams are tied at Win% and one of those teams has more wins than the other, than the team with more wins will be awarded the higher seed <u>UNLESS</u> the team with less wins holds the advantage over the team with more wins in #2- Head to Head record.

Playoff Weather Guidelines

Teams must attempt to get their field ready for games. The coaches/Athletic Office should stay in contact throughout the day. Home or alternative field playability must be determined by 1:30 pm on school days. Weekend/holiday game field determination deadlines will be established by the Baseball Coordinator as necessary.

- 1. If the home team's field is NOT playable
 - a. The home team will be granted the first opportunity to secure an alternative site for their home game on the same day.
 - b. If an alternative site cannot be found by the home team, the away team will host if their field is playable OR the away team can secure an alternative site for the game on the same day if their field is not playable.
- 2. If a game has to be moved from the original home field to visiting team's choice field*:
 - a. If Game 1 is moved: Lower seed will be home game 1. Games 2 & 3 will be at higher seed with higher seed being the home team for both games.
 - b. If Game 2 is moved: Lower seed will be home team @ higher seed. If this happens, Game 3 will remain unchanged.
 - c. If a game has to be moved in a 1 game playoff, or the final game of a series (game 3), then the original home team will remain the HOME team.

*If any game is moved to home team's choice field, the original home team will remain the HOME team.


PITCH COUNT/CHART RULES



- 1 If a pitch is thrown on a balk call, the pitch will NOT count for the purposes of this rule
- 2 A pitcher at any level who reaches the pitch count limit in the middle of an at-bat will be allowed to finish that hitter. Thr number of nights rest is determined by the actual number of pitches thrown.
- 3 Schools will have the responsibility to maintain all pitching charts. They will also be required to make any game chart available to any school prior to any game to show availability of pitchers for that given day.
- During games each team will record pitch counts on the official NYSPHSAA pitch count form, this should not include warm-ups or pick off attempts. After each half inning the pitch counts will be confirmed by both teams. Any discrepancy will be resolved based on the records of the home team pitch count chart.
- 5 At game's conclusion, the NYSPHSAA pitch count form will be signed by both head coaches or designated representative.
- 6 Any violation of this rule will be considered in the same light as a school using an ineligible player. The game will be forfeited.
- 7 As per the NYSPHSAA handbook any additional penalties may be imposed at the school or section level.

Tied and Suspended Game Rule

To be used for NYSPHSAA Championship Tournament. May also be used during regular season play with Section approval:

- 1. An official game is 5 innings or 4 and one-half if the home team is ahead. If a winner can be determined and no more baseball can be played that day, the game is over and a winner is declared. The game does not have to go 7 innings.
- 2. If a game is stopped before it becomes an official game, the game is a suspended game. This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter etc. should all be recorded in the scorebook.
- 3. If the game is stopped after having gone long enough to be an official game, however a winner cannot be determined due to a tied score. This game becomes a tied/suspended game at that point score, inning, count of batter etc., should all be recorded in the scorebook.
- 4. If a game is stopped after having gone long enough to become an official game and;
- a. The visitors score a run or runs in the top half of the inning. Then game reverts back to the last completed inning and either a winner is declared, or we have a tied/suspended game. Or,
- b. The visitors score a run or run in the top half of the inning and the home team does not complete they're at bat. The game reverts back to the last completed inning and either a winner is declared, or we have a tied/suspended game. If we have a tied/suspended game, we pick up from that point (Visitors runs in the top half of the inning and home team runs in the bottom half count). This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter etc., should all be recorded in the scorebook.
- c. The home team ties the game in the bottom half of the inning but doesn't complete the inning. If we cannot play anymore we have a tied/suspended game at point. This game will be picked up at that point. Score, inning, count of batter, etc., should all be recorded in the scorebook. Or,
- d. The home team takes the lead in the bottom half of the 5th or 6th inning, and then the game is called. At that point, the home team is declared the winner.



THUNDER & LIGHTNING POLICY October 2001

Applied to regular season through NYSPHSAA Finals:

- 1. Thunder and lightning necessitates that contests be suspended. The occurrence of thunder and/or lightning is not subject to interpretation or discussion-thunder is thunder, lightning is lightning.
- a. With your site administrator, set up a plan for shelter prior to the start of any contest.
- 2. When thunder is heard and /or lightning is seen, the following procedures should be adhered to:
- A. Suspend play and direct participants to go to shelter, a building normally occupied by the public or if a building is unavailable, participants should go inside a vehicle with a solid metal top (e.g. bus, van, and car).
- B. Do not permit people to stand under or near a tree; and have all stay away from poles, antennas, towers and underground watering systems.
- C. After thunder and /or lightning have left the area, wait 30 minutes after the last boom is heard or strike is seen before resuming play or competition.



HEAT INDEX PROCEDURES

Administration of Heat Index Procedures:

- Feels Like Temperature (Heat index) or THI using a Wet Bulb indicator on the field will be checked 1 hour before
 the contest/practice by a certified athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee when the air
 temperature is 80 degrees (Fahrenheit) or higher.
- Download WeatherBug app to your phone or log into <u>www.weatherbug.com</u>. Schools may also use a Wet Bulb indicator on the field that will be used.
- Enter zip code or city and state in the location section of the app or on-line or determine the THI by using a Wet Bulb indicator.
- If the Feels Like temperature (heat index) or the Wet Bulb Indicator is 90 degrees or above, the athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee must re-check the Feels Like temperature (heat index) or Wet Bulb indicator at halftime or midway point of the contest. If the Feels Like temperature (heat index) or Wet Bulb indicator is 96 degrees (Fahrenheit) or more, the contest will be suspended.

Please refer to the following chart to take the appropriate actions:

WIND CHILL PROCEDURES

Administration of Wind Chill Procedures:

- Feels Like Temperature (Wind Chill) will be checked 1 hour before the contest/practice by a
 certified athletic trainer, athletic director, or school designee when the air temperature is 39
 degrees (Fahrenheit) or lower.
- Download WeatherBug app to your phone or log into www.weatherbug.com.
- . Enter zip code or city and state in the location section of the app or on-line.
- If the Feels Like temperature (wind chill) is 10 degrees or below, the athletic trainer, athletic
 director, or school designee must re-check the Feels Like (wind chill) at halftime or midway point
 of the contest. If the Feels Like (wind chill) temperature is -11 degrees (Fahrenheit) or lower,
 the contest will be suspended.

Please refer to the following chart to take the appropriate actions:

SECTION VIII SPORTSMANSHIP POLICY

The NYSPHSAA and Section VIII recognizes and appreciates that the influence and responsibility of the school administration with regard to good sportsmanship extends to all levels of competition. However, it must also be seen that the NYSPHSAA and Section VIII has been vested with the responsibility to ensure that all contests under its jurisdiction are conducted satisfactorily. This standard applies to all regular season and post season play.

As of July 1, 2013, the Dignity for All Students Act (Dignity Act-Section 52.2, Part 80 and 57-4) is to provide all public school students with an environment free from harassment, bullying (including cyber bullying) and discrimination, as well as to foster civility in public schools. The Dignity Act focuses on the prevention of discrimination behaviors, including harassment/bullying through the promotion of educational measures meant to positively impact school culture and climate, which includes the interscholastic programs. While the Dignity for all Students act mentions its efforts to keep an environment free of discrimination and bullying; diversity, equity and inclusion are very important to us.

It is imperative that we can provide an environment where all kids fell safe, no matter their race or ethnicity. This should always apply, no matter if it's a practice, scrimmage, regular season game or play-off game.

The High School Athletic Association of Section VIII established the Sportsmanship Committee as a sub-committee of the Athletic Council to address incidents of unsportsmanlike conduct and flagrant misconduct. The purpose of the Sportsmanship Committee is to take proactive measures in an effort to minimize inappropriate behavior at all Section VIII events and to promote positive sporting behavior throughout the county.

A. What is to be reported:

- 1. A Player who is ejected from a contest for flagrant misconduct and/or unsportsmanlike conduct.
- 2. A Spectator who acts in a disruptive abusive or inappropriate manner.
- 3. A Coach who conducts himself/herself in an inappropriate or unsportsmanlike manner.
- 4. An Official who demonstrates unsportsmanlike conduct or inappropriate behavior unbecoming of a sport official.
- 5. A School that permits spectators to conduct themselves in an abusive, disruptive or harassing manner. This also includes schools that do not provide adequate supervision at home or away contests to control their spectators.

B. Responsibility for reporting:

- 1. Coaches must report all incidents to their respective athletic directors, even if only one player/team was cited for misconduct.
- Athletic Directors must file reports with the Office of the Executive Director within 24 hours of any disqualification, ejection or incident of unsportsmanlike behavior.
- 3. Officials must file reports with the Office of the Executive Director within 24 hours of any disqualification, ejection or incident of unsportsmanlike behavior.

C. Reporting Procedure:

- 1. All unsportsmanlike incidents are to be reported by the coach (or by both coaches) to their respective athletic directors immediately following the contest.
- The Athletic Directors of both schools involved are to file reports with the office of the Executive Director as soon as possible, but no later than the morning following the contest/incident (or the next school day)._The Officials assigned to the contest are to file a

- report with the Office of the Executive Director as soon as possible, but no later than the morning following the contest/incident (or the next school day).
- 3. The Office of the Executive Director will forward copies of all reports to the Sportsmanship Committee Chairperson, Sport Coordinator and the appropriate VP of Male/Female Sports.

D. Committee Actions:

- 1. All member schools including individuals representing member schools who are involved in unsportsmanlike conduct are subject to consequences deemed appropriate by the Sportsmanship Committee.
 - a)The Sportsmanship Committee may recommend action in instances of unsportsmanlike conduct and is authorized to recommend consequences which may include, but are not limited to: Censure, Reprimand, Suspension, Loss of Eligibility, or any other actions that are deemed appropriate by the Sportsmanship Committee.
- 2. All recommendations of the Sportsmanship Committee will be filed with the Office of the Executive Director and forwarded to the Athletic Director(s) of the school(s) involved.
- 3. All actions of the Sportsmanship Committee are subject to review by the respective Athletic Director(s). *Schools may impose additional consequences*.
- 4. Copies of all reports of the Sportsmanship Committee shall be kept on file with the Sportsmanship Chairperson, the Executive Director and the Sports Coordinator.

E. Penalties: SEE UPDATED REGULATIONS AS OF 9/26/2024 ON PGS. 45-46

1. Player Expulsion:

Any player who commits a serious violation of game rules or takes part in flagrant misconduct during play shall be subject to ejection from the contest and disciplinary action. Ejection from a contest results in mandatory one (1) game suspension from the next regularly scheduled contest, including post-season play. Disqualifications from one season will carry over to the player's next season of participation. Any player suspended from participation may not be on site or involved in any capacity (spectator, timekeeper, scorekeeper, etc.) on the day of suspension. Failure to comply will result in additional sanctions being levied against the individual, coach and/or team. Any spectator(s) who acts in a manner causing the contest to be suspended or the spectator removed in any capacity (timekeeper, scorekeeper, etc.) at the next contest. Failure to comply will result in additional sanctions being leveled against this spectator(s) by the school district as well as Section VIII.

2. Second Occurrence of Misconduct:

In the same sport – NYSPHSAA requires a two game suspension for the second (2^{nd)} ejection and a third (3^{rd)} ejection in the same sport will result in the loss of the season. Any person (coach, player, spectator, school official, etc.) who is ejected from a second contest in the same sport for unsportsmanlike conduct shall require the Sportsmanship Committee to review the matter. This may lead to more severe disciplinary action including suspension for the remainder of the season. Such disciplinary action could carry over into subsequent sports seasons. Additional consequences may also be recommended by the Sportsmanship Committee.

3. Intentional Physical Contact by a Player:

Any member of the squad who strikes, shoves, kicks or makes other physical contact with the intent to annoy, harass or intimidate an official, another player, a spectator, coach, school district employee or supervisor, etc. shall be expelled from the game immediately and banned from further participation in all sports for a period of time to be determined by the Section not to exceed one year from the date of the offense. **NOTE:** Members of the squad include players, managers, score keepers, timers, and statisticians. The incident must be reported to the Office of the Executive Director who will in turn forward to the Sportsmanship Committee and respective Sports Coordinator. Consequences may include but are not limited to: Censure, Reprimand, Suspension, Loss of Eligibility, or another action that is deemed appropriate by the committee.

4. <u>Team Members/Non Participant/Pre-or Post-Game Misconduct:</u>
Any act of unsportsmanlike/flagrant misconduct by either a team member, non- participant before or after (pre and post-game) will be excluded from play in and/or subject to removal from

the site of the contest. Any player, coach or spectator who commits a serious violation of the sportsmanship rules or takes part in flagrant misconduct as a non-participant after the contest has concluded (post-game) will be suspended from participation in or attendance at the next regularly scheduled contest including the post-season.

5. Spectators:

Any spectator who acts in a disruptive, abusive or unsportsmanlike manner may cause the game to be suspended or the spectator removed from the site. A letter from the Sportsmanship Committee may be sent to the appropriate Athletic Director(s), Building Principal(s) and Superintendent(s). Continued incidents of disruptive behavior may result in additional disciplinary action by the Sportsmanship Committee.

6. Coaches:

Any coach excluded by a certified official from an interschool competition for unsportsmanlike conduct, including taunting, is ineligible to coach any interschool competition in that sport until after the next previously scheduled contest at the same level (e.g. junior varsity, varsity, etc.) has been completed. In individual sports a multi-day contest is considered to be a contest. Disqualification from one season carries over to the next season of participation. The coach may not be present at the game site nor communicate in any manner during the contest with any person present at the site.

NOTE: "Not being physically present at the site" means a disqualified coach is not to be present in the locker room, on the sidelines, in the stands or site area before, during or after the game/meet. Any coach that does not serve the penalty for violating the Sportsmanship Standard will be ineligible to participate in the next two regularly scheduled contests. If the coach continues to not serve the penalty, the matter will be referred to the Section for further action. If the coach is involved in the NYSPHSAA play-offs, the matter will be referred to the Executive Director of the NYSPHSAA.

7. Intentional Physical Contact:

A coach who strikes, shoves, kick or makes other physical contact with the intent to annoy, harass or intimidate another person (e.g. official, another coach, player, fan) shall be expelled immediately and banned from further participation or coaching in all sports for a period of time to be determined by the section not to exceed one year from the date of the offense.

8. Officials:

An official who demonstrates inappropriate or unsportsmanlike conduct will be reported to the Sportsmanship Committee. The Sportsmanship Committee may recommend disciplinary action to be taken against the official by the official's organization.

9. Taunting:

Taunting includes, but is not limited to, any actions or comments by coaches, players, or spectators which are intended to bait, anger, embarrass, ridicule or demean other players, coaches, or game officials. Included in this is conduct that berates, needles, intimidates, or threatens based on gender, ethnic origin or background and conduct that attacks religious beliefs, size, economic status, speech, family special needs, or personal matters. Examples of taunting that would lead to ejection include, but are not limited to, physical and verbal intimidation outside the spirit of the game ("trash talking"), reference to sexual orientation, "inthe-face confrontation" by one player to another, standing over, straddling a tackled or fallen player, etc.

10. Bench Clearing:

If an altercation occurs during a contest and members of either team leave their respective bench or sideline area or playing positions, and go onto the playing field/court participation area, they will be immediately ejected from the contest for unsportsmanlike behavior.

11. Due Process:

Students, coaches and schools have the right to be heard by the Sportsmanship Committee. However, appeals will only be held in regard to a misapplication of the sport rules and/or an ejection of a misidentified player. This right must be claimed within 24 hours of the incident occurring and must be made to the Office of the Executive Director of Section VIII. All actions of the Sportsmanship Committee may be appealed by a member school. Any such appeal will be heard by the Section VIII Athletic Council.

Approved 6/9/21

The Coach is Expected to:

- 1. Set a positive example both on and off the playing area.
- Be aware that he/she is representing a school district, a school and a student body. Impressions made are lasting and hard to live down.
- Recognize that athletic competition is a means toward an end, not an end in itself. Specifically, athletics should lead to the development of healthy, well adjusted young men and women.
- 4. Approach competition as a healthy and constructive exercise, not as a life and death struggle that requires victory at any price. It should be fun and enjoyable.
- Recognize that the participants in individual or team sports are young men and women with human frailties and limitations who are capable of making mistakes.
- 6. Be prepared to win or lose. Be positive. Encourage peak performance within the rules of the game.
- 7. Command respect by personal attitude and behavior.
- 8. Be well groomed. Wear appropriate attire.
- Refrain from the use of crude, racist or abusive language or gestures with players, opponents, officials, or spectators. (6/21)
- 10. Create an environment where diversity, equity and inclusion are present. (6/21)
- 11. Respect the judgment of officials. Although it is reasonable for the coach to question officials' decisions, and even to disagree, the officials' decisions must be accepted graciously. Questionable decisions may be referred to the Section VIII Protest Committee.
- Handle dissatisfaction with officiating quietly and efficiently through the use of the rating cards supplied by BOCES.
- 13. Avoid behavior that will incite players, opponents, or spectators.
- 14. Instruct players to respect officials. Questions concerning rules or interpretations should be made by the team captain as the team representative during the contest.
- Encourage good sportsmanship and remove players from competition who demonstrate unacceptable behavior.
- Support and treat the athletic program as a total part of the educational opportunities provided for all students.

II. The Athlete is Expected to:

- Understand that the student athletic program is a total part of the educational opportunities provided for all students. It should be treated as just that.
- Conduct himself/herself as a gentleman/lady at all times.
- Demonstrate self-control and mutual respect at all times. Uncontrolled emotion can be selfdefeating.
- Refrain from the use of crude, racist or abusive language or gestures with players, opponents, officials, or spectators. (6/21)
- 5. Practice diversity, equity and inclusion within their team. (6/21)
- Accept victory with grace and defeat with dignity. Poor winners or losers do a disservice to themselves.
- Set an example in word and deed, both on and off the playing area. Remember that athletes assume a role of leadership and that the young emulate their role models.

III. The Spectators are Expected to

- 1. Refrain from using noisemakers. The use of noisemakers is prohibited at all events.
- 2. Conform to accepted standards of good sportsmanship and behavior.
- 3. Respect officials, coaches and players and extend all courtesies to them.
- 4. Refrain from the use of crude, racist or abusive language or gestures with players, opponents, officials, or spectators. (6/21)
- Obey the regulations of the building and grounds. Those who do not conform should be brought to the attention of the building authorities.
- Understand that schools are responsible for the conduct of their respective spectators whether at home or away.

IV. The Administrators and Supervisors

- The athletic director may delegate certain responsibilities and authority to the site supervisor, but ultimate responsibility rests with the athletic director, principal, superintendent and the board of education.
- The athletic director or his/her designee is responsible for the conduct of coaches, players, spectators, and other employees of the school.
- The athletic director or his/her designee assumes responsibility for informing these groups of the code of behavior expected during participation in Section VIII athletic events.
 - a. Any negative sportsmanship or communication by a spectator directed at officials, it is the job of the supervisor or athletic administrator to alert the spectator of possible removal or removal from the contest.

4. General Recommendations for Home School

- The visiting school should be provided with information on directions to the school, game times, physical layout including parking area, locker facilities and specific school regulations affecting visiting teams.
- The home school is responsible for excluding, from athletic events, students whose past behavior indicates an unacceptable risk for trouble.
- Adequate supervision must be provided in the gymnasium area as well as in hallways, bathrooms and outside areas where students may congregate.
- Separate seating areas should be designated for visiting team spectators.
- Request cooperation of the Nassau County Police Department and/or Auxiliary Police units whenever the anticipated crowd size or previous relationships between schools indicate the potential for trouble.
- Confer with the coaches, cheering advisors, supervisors and custodial help on expectations for their behavior and on ways to handle difficult situations.
- g. Direct the athletic directors to meet with game officials to emphasize the importance of keeping the game under control.
- h. Direct supervisor in charge to immediately report to police any information regarding student possession of weapons, drugs or alcohol. Students under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol shall be removed from the game and reported to the administration.
- Escort the officials to their cars if requested by the sport official.
- Direct supervisors to remain on duty until all spectators and visiting teams have left the premises, including parking lots.
- k. Problems with students, coaches and spectators should be communicated to the other athletic director and to the principals, and when appropriate, to the Section VIII Executive Director.

5. Requirement for Schools/Teams Participating in Playoffs at Neutral Sites

It is required that any school/team participating in a Section VIII playoff activity at a neutral site provide adequate supervision for that activity. The supervisor(s) must be easily identifiable and maintain a visible presence throughout the activity.

6. General Recommendations for visiting Teams

- a. Visiting teams must be properly supervised at all times at the host school.
- b. At spectator events, the visiting school should provide a supervisor for its spectators. When a varsity/junior varsity doubleheader is held, the team <u>not</u> playing should be supervised in the stands.
- c. Clarify with the host athletic director the best area for parking and access into locker facilities. Also, arrange for exiting after the event with at least one home school supervisor in the area to supervise.
- d. Report in writing to the host athletic director any incident involving players, spectators, supervisors, etc. that deserves follow-up by the home school.

V. Recommendations for the Visiting School

1. Athletic Director

- a. Contact the athletic director of the home school and request the following:
 - (1) Directions and best route to the school.
 - (2) Location of parking area and recommended area for bus parking.
 - (3) Will there be a charge for spectators and is there a specific seating area for visitors.
 - (4) Does the home school require supervisors for the visiting school and if so, how many.
- 1. Inform the athletic director of the home school of the following:
 - (1) Whether there will be a cheerleader and/or spectator bus in addition to the athletes' bus.
 - (2) Whether additional buses will be accompanied by one or more supervisors.
 - (3) Whether the home school is expected to provide supervision of athletes, cheerleaders and spectators to visiting buses at the end of the contest.
 - (4) What type of identification supervisors of the visiting team will be equipped with.
- 2. Inform the coach of the team of the particulars in a. and b. above.
- Inform supervisors of the above information and ask them to inform persons on the bus, they are responsible for, of the pertinent information.
- 4. Inform the students of any necessary details by public address system and/or bulletin.

2. Coach

- a. Consult the athletic director for the above information.
- b. The head coach of each sport should disseminate the information above for each school to his or her junior varsity and junior high school team coaches.
- Follow the recommendations for Code of Behavior for Coaches in Section VIII.
- d. Require team members to follow Section VIII Guidelines for good sportsmanship.

Supervisors

- a. Should be persons who are familiar with the visiting school's student body.
- Should be well informed of what their responsibilities are and be capable of enforcing regulations and encourage proper behavior.



NASSAU COUNTY PUBLIC HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION/SECTION VIII PROCEDURES FOR PROTESTS OF ATHLETIC EVENTS

Approved June 2017

- The protesting coach will inform the referee and the opposing coach at that point in the game immediately following the situation protested.
- The time, score and situation will be identified in the scorebook (if applicable) or recorded, by an official or both coaches, as soon as the protest is announced to the officials and opposing coach.
- A subsequent protest in the same game will be required to be announced and recorded, using the same procedures described above for each specific point of protest.
- 4. The protesting coach is required to notify the sport coordinator within 24 hours of the contest.
- 5. The athletic director of the protesting school is required to file a written protest giving specific details of the situation, time and score to the Office of the Executive Director within 24 hours of the contest. The report must be accompanied by \$75.00 check payable to the Section VIII Athletic Council. The protest will require the signatures of the coach, athletic director and principal of the school. Copies of the protest must be sent to the sport coordinator, the protest chairperson and the opposing coach within 24 hours of the contest by the protesting school.
- The Section VIII sport coordinator will notify the Executive Director of Section VIII who in turn will notify the game officials involved and direct that a written statement from the game officials be filed with the sport coordinator within 24 hours.
- 7. The sport coordinator will arrange for a meeting as soon as possible. The following should be included or be represented:
 - a. The protesting coach
 - b. The opposing coach
 - c. A rules interpreter
 - d. Sport Coordinator of that sport
 - e. Office of the Executive Director
- Attendance of the game officials involved in the protested contest will be mandatory, unless extenuating circumstances preclude their attendance.

Protest Committee Options:

- a. To deny the protest
- b. To uphold the protest and direct that the game be replayed form the point of protest.
- c. To uphold and protest and direct that the game be replayed in its entirety.
- To deny the protest and recommend some further action by the High School Association.
- e. To uphold the protest and recommend some further action to the High School Association.
- An appeal of the decision of the Protest Committee may be made. This request must be filed within 72
 hours of notification of this decision to the Section VIII Appeals Committee upon submission of a \$75.00
 fee (a second \$75.00 fee if original protestor).
- 10. In the case of a protest or an appeal that is upheld, the fee will be returned.




Diagram 2
